### Summer Term (ii) Newsletter

Dear Parent / Carers,

It seems just a very short time since the last newsletter, but this Friday we close for the half term break. While the week includes the Spring Bank Holiday, many of our families will also be celebrating Eid al Adha. As such we wish all stakeholders a good holiday and quality time with family and friends.

#### Attendance and Term Time Leave

Our work on attendance remains ongoing and data will continue to be interrogated. It is important that **all** parents support their child/children, as well as the school, and work towards the expectation of 96%, which limits absence to no more than 8 days over an academic year.



As we approach the summer months, a reminder too, that Head teachers can only authorise leave in exceptional situations. **General family holidays or cheaper travel are not considered valid excuses** and parents are requested to adhere to the agreed holiday periods. This year the school closes on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> July which allows for earlier flights and enables families to make appropriate travel arrangements. Should additional leave be taken, a fine can be triggered if a child has 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a 10-school-week period.

#### Yr.6

The school acknowledges the hard work of our Yr.6 pupils in preparing for their SATs. In their administration last week, the children's focus, use of strategies taught over the year and their sheer effort, was plain to see, and we all hope they get the results they deserve. These will be made available to all schools on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> July, and we will formally share the information with parents in the children's annual report.

Please note the Yr.6 Induction (transition) day at secondary schools is Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> July. Individual schools may though have different or additional transition day, and parents are advised to check their child's specific secondary school website for their tailored timeline.

#### Statutory Assessments

Over this half term there will be statutory assessments across all key stages. **Yr.4** will be completing the **Multiplication Tables Check** (1<sup>st</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> June), while **Yr.1** will be undertaking the **Phonics Screening Check** (8<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> June). The **Early Years Foundation Stage Profile** is used to measure a child's development and learning by the end of their **Reception** year and this too will be finalised in the next few weeks.

While no longer statutory, the school also chooses to administer **KS1 SATs**. The assessments in reading and maths allows the school to measure progress and identify specific areas where a child might need additional learning support as they transition in to Key Stage 2. In response to this, **Yr.2** will be completing these assessments **throughout the month of June**.

#### Grammar School Entry Exams

Registration is now open for parents of current Year 5 pupils who would like their child to sit the entrance test for a place at any of the grammar schools in Birmingham/West Midlands (entry to Year 7 in September 2027).

Registration can be made online by visiting the website below. If you are interested in registering your child please do so before the closing date on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> June 2026 at 4.00pm. The test is then timetabled to take place on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> September 2026.

### **Swimming Sessions**

During the second half of the summer term, we will work with Aspire, who will provide us with an on-site swimming pool with temperature-control, fully filtered water as well as qualified, experienced swimming instructors.

Swimming is part of the national curriculum for PE in primary schools, meaning that all children in Yrs. 3 – 6 are expected to participate in these sessions. It's a minimum requirement for children to leave primary school, able to swim confidently and safely for at least 25 metres, but in addition to this, they will be taught how to perform safe, self-rescue.



Further details of each classes swimming sessions will follow a little nearer the time. The required swimming kit for boys will though consist of knee length shorts, while for girls it will be a swimming burkini /costume which can be worn with tight leggings (to the ankles) and a long-sleeved top. The children will also need a swimming cap and of course a towel, and waterproof bag to store their kit.
